The annual MASS FOR THE ANOINTING OF THE SICK will be celebrated next Saturday (February 9th), which is the nearest day to the feast day of Our Lady of Lourdes. This is a Diocesan event and the Bishop will be joined by other priests to celebrate the Sacrament of Anointing.

The feast day of Our Lady of Lourdes (February 11th) is also the World Day of Prayer for the Sick. This day was instituted by Pope John Paul II, who hoped it would become "a privileged time of prayer, of sharing, of offering one's sufferings for the good of the Church, and a call for all to recognize in the features of their suffering brothers and sisters the Holy Face of Christ."
