We are now entering into **Holy Week** – the high point of the Church's year. Please take one of the leaflets detailing our Cathedral liturgies for Holy Week.

Today is **Palm Sunday** – please note that all our Masses will begin with a procession, starting in the garden for the 11am Solemn Mass, and in the Narthex hall for all other Masses.

On **Palm Sunday at 6pm** there is also an Ecumenical service at the Methodist Church on Chapelfield Road, where the preacher will be Canon Paul. Please support this ecumenical initiative for Easter.

The **Sacrament of Confession** is available every day throughout Holy Week between 10am and 11am. Do take this opportunity to encounter the great love and mercy of Jesus Christ in the Sacrament.

Lent with the Gospel of St John

Throughout Lent we have been reading the Gospel of St John, as a way of journeying more closely with Our Lord. Reading ½ a chapter each day, we complete the Gospel this week!

To read this week: Chapters 19 – 21.

Three things to look out for this week:

- (1) Jesus placing His mother in the care of the beloved disciple John (John 19:27). St John here represents all Christian disciples who are asked by Our Lord to take Mary into their home and into their hearts.
- (2) Jesus handing onto the apostles His authority to forgive sins (John 20:22) – which is in turn handed on to priests in the Sacrament of Confession.
- (3) Jesus forgiving Peter for his three-fold denial of Him, and His commission to Peter to 'feed my sheep' – to be the Shepherd of the Church (John 21:17), just as the Pope is today.
