Ascension of the Lord. This Thursday is the Solemnity of the Ascension of the Lord, which commemorates Jesus's ascension into heaven, 40 days after the Resurrection. In the Ascension Jesus does not separate Himself from us, so much as to reveal to us our final destination, where we are to follow Him.

The Ascension of the Lord is a Holy Day of Obligation when we should all go to Mass. There are Masses at 7.30am, 10am, 12.30pm, and 7.30pm after the Newman Lecture.
