# The Cathedral of St John the Baptist – summary of the financial accounts for the nine months ended 31<sup>st</sup> December 2021

#### **Assets**

#### Income

Twelve months to 31<sup>st</sup> December 2021 £232k (£2k more than budget)

We received legacies totalling £36k which had not been budgeted for. Largely offsetting this positive variance to income, offertory donations were £21k below budget, which was attributed to lower attendances at the start of 2021 because of the 3<sup>rd</sup> lockdown. We received less income than had been budgeted for chaplaincy services to the hospital and the ongoing pandemic meant that parish activities continued to be restricted during the year, some of which would have generated additional income to support their associated cost.

## **Expenditure**

Twelve months to 31<sup>st</sup> December 2021 £217k (£58k less than budget)

A lot of this variance could be attributed to prudent budget setting, which allowed for spending to return to more normal (pre-pandemic) levels in 2021, when in fact a lot of the parish's activities in the year continued to be restricted by the pandemic, such as that which had been earmarked for parish outings and pilgrimages. The cost of levies from the diocese was also £19k less than had been budgeted for, with this figure being lower than it was in 2020 (upon which the 2021 budget figure had been based) because the levies are based on a % of the previous year's offertory collection, and the 2020 offertory takings were lower than they had been in 2019.

#### Surplus / (deficit)

Twelve months to 31st December 2021 £15k surplus (£60k more than budget)
