We are delighted that the Holy Father has appointed Canon Peter Collins from the Diocese of Cardiff to be the 5th Bishop of East Anglia. His Episcopal Ordination will be celebrated in our cathedral at **11:30 on the 14th of December.** The Cathedral's doors will open at 10:00 on that day - entrance into the cathedral will be through a numerated ticket only. Although our cathedral does have a capacity for well over 1200 people, space will be *extremely* limited as we have to consider guests from every parish in the diocese, all the bishops of England and Wales, civil guests and representatives from our schools.

As a parish we will be given a set number of tickets (approximately two dozen at this stage) so tickets will be in short supply. If you are able to attend (and only if you are truly available on that day) and you would like to be here for the ordination, then please pass your name and contact details to Cathy in the office - either by email or through the letterbox before 01 December. The allocation will not be on a first-come-first-served basis but rather, once the deadline is finished, we will use a randomly generated system to allocate the few tickets that we have available and contact only those who have been successful. If you are successful in obtaining a ticket and unable to use it, then please refuse the ticket so it can be passed onto the next person. This seems to be the fairest method for administrating the tickets for this function. In order to have as wide a spread of the community as possible, tickets will be given to individuals only.
