On Sunday the 8<sup>th</sup> of January, all of us at Holy Apostles Parish strolled down the lane to the nearby scout-hut with a feeling of anticipation; it was a windy and damp day, but this did not seem to curb anyone's enthusiasm. Today we were going to celebrate Christmas as a community with a nativity play hosted by most of the children in the parish (everyone seemed to have a part) followed by a bring-and-share lunch. The children and catechists had spent time over many weeks and many, many hours rehearsing the play and learning the songs by heart. Some parents told me that the songs were practiced almost daily in their homes over the last few weeks. Once the stage was set and the sound system tweaked and everyone had found a seat, we were ready to begin. For me, it was a great exercise in seeing the children enjoying some wholesome fun that was not linked to computers or wokery - just good fun where our children could be themselves for a while.

After the concert we all enjoyed the bring-and-share lunch with foods from many different parts of the world, there was plenty of food for everyone and a great atmosphere of sharing, laughter and joy enveloped the scout-hut as the great feast began. The parents, catechists and children of Holy Apostles Parish worked extremely hard over many weeks to prepare the concert and many hours in the kitchen to produce a menu that was varied and vibrant.
