Fr Denis Finbow convicted - Fr Finbow was charged in January 2022 by officers from Cambridgeshire Police with the offences relating to his service as a Catholic priest in Peterborough in the 1980s and 1990s. Following a recent six-day trial, Fr Finbow has been convicted by a jury of three counts of indecent assault on a child and found not guilty of the remaining three offences. He has been released on unconditional bail for sentence at Huntingdon Crown Court on March 8, 2023. In a statement to the press, Bishop Peter said: “Following Fr Finbow’s conviction, I shall now be seeking urgent legal advice regarding initiating the process of his laicisation (removal of his clerical status and rights), in accordance with our safeguarding policies and procedures.” For the full statement from Bishop Peter, please see the diocesan website: <https://www.rcdea.org.uk/retired-peterborough-priest-convicted-of-historic-abuse/>.
