Several years ago, the Vatican provided clarification on the respect we pay to our loved ones' remains should they decide to be cremated. The Vatican decreed that, 'the ashes of loved ones have no place in the home, and certainly not in jewellery. It urged that cremated remains be preserved in cemeteries or other approved sacred places'. The ashes should **never** be scattered 'in the air, on land or at sea'.

The Columbarium at St John's Cathedral is situated in the beautiful vaulted under-croft at the east end of the cathedral, beneath the Sanctuary and the Blessed Sacrament Chapel. The entrance is located from Cathedral House car park on the right-hand side of the entrance to the Sacristy. It is a place reserved for a dignified and worthy resting place for cremated ashes of Catholics and members of their families who are not Catholic. As St John's is the Cathedral church of the Diocese of East Anglia, the Columbarium is available for all Catholics in the diocese as well as members of St John's parish.

The cost to arrange an interment in the Columbarium is £2,000 for each niche and members of St John's parish and Cathedral Friends are entitled to a discount of £250 in recognition of their support to the Cathedral. Payments can be made fully or over a period of time. The agreed donation will be kept in a special fund and will go towards the upkeep of the Cathedral and Columbarium. In this way, those using the Columbarium retain an association with St John's long after their passing.

If you are interested in finding out more about this beautiful place, or visiting your loved ones there, the Columbarium will be open from 11.00am until 2.00pm on All Souls Day (Thursday 2 November). The annual blessing of the Columbarium will take place after the 10:00 o'clock Mass on All Souls Day. All are very welcome.
