**Wednesday 1<sup>st</sup> November** is the Solemnity of **All Saints** and is a Holy Day of Obligation.

**All Souls' Day** - This Thursday, 02 November, the columbarium will be blessed after the 10:00 Mass. Also, on the same day, two of our volunteers will be hosting an 'open day' in the columbarium between 11:00 and 14:00. **Adoration for the First Fridays** will take place on Friday 3<sup>rd</sup> November. **RISE UP!** Saturday 11th November, from 1pm– 8pm in St. John's Cathedral, Norwich. A special event for young people (Year 7 upwards), Catechists and Youth Leaders to be empowered to Rise Up and celebrate World Youth Sunday in their own parishes later in November. With live music, inspiring talks, powerful prayer times and special guests, ending with a vigil Mass followed by refreshments.

**The redundant James Scott Organ** that sat in the south transept without being used for at least 25 years has found a new home! We offered the organ to a family who have bought a disused convent, which will be used as a community centre, in France that dates back to the same age as the organ. As the organ is in need of significant repairs and is simply gathering dust, this appears to be a good use for the instrument. A team of workers and volunteers arrived last week and painstakingly dismantled the organ with the promise that they will repair, re-tune and, above all **USE** the organ once it has been reassembled.

Whilst they were with us, they videoed the operation for their YouTube channel and is now available to view in five parts, see link for first episode and for access to the other four through their YouTube page. One good turn deserves another: Unbeknownst to us, the family have set up a 'go fund me' link to their YouTube videos to help us to begin to save money for a new organ for the cathedral when we are in a position to acquire one.
